## Porsche develops £10 MILLION superyacht - but there will only be seven in the world

Luxury car maker Porsche has unveiled its first ever superyacht - a 35-metre aluminium beast with twin 1213kW engines, capable of reaching a maximum speed of 21 knots.

Developed in partnership with yacht builder Dynamiq, the yacht has a sporty exterior design and features a specially engineered stabilisation system with four electric fins and interceptors.

With a shallow draft of just 1.45 metres, it is ideal for the Mediterranean, Caribbean or Southeast Asia, but is also capable of crossing the Atlantic, with a range of 3,400 nautical miles.

It comes with an optional hybrid power system. Two engine rooms with twin 45kW Fischer Panda variable-speed generators are located in the bow.

This layout ensures silence at night, and avoids smoke and fumes at anchor while the owner and guests are swimming or sunbathing on the aft platform.

"Taking the spirit of high-performance sportscar styling to the high seas, the Dynamiq GTT 115 is designed to appeal to car lovers and forward-thinking yacht owners who appreciate the advantages of speed, style and our philosophy of intelligent performance," says Roland Heiler, managing director of the Porsche Design Studio.

On the inside, the yacht features three or four luxury cabins with Saddle brown and Luxor beige leather with carbon fibre details, and surfaces of Sahara Noir marble. All of the interior ceilings are at least 2.15 metres in height.

The deck cushions feature fabric centres with a classic Pepita houndstooth pattern, and the furniture and decoration were developed in association with the Italian designer brand Minotti.

The yacht has been named the Dynamiq GTT 115 Hybrid, where GTT stands for Grand Turismo Transatlantic. Dynamiq claims it is the ideal size for six guests and six crew.

It comes in a choice of Porsche Carrara white, Rhodium Silver, Chalk or custom Monte-Carlo Blue, and every aspect of the yacht is customisable - from paint colours to interiors and electronics.

A limited edition of just seven GTT 115 yachts will be manufactured, with prices starting from €11,900,000 (£10,228,970).

The first model is available for sale with delivery in September 2017. Customers can expect delivery within 15 months from the date of order.
